The 84-85 program year will close with "Japanese Labor/Management Relations In Industry." Come and get some first hand insight into Japanese business approaches and thinking.


I wish to sincerely thank the Section and Divisions' officers, Governing Boards and the membership for making this past year's programs successful. Your efforts are appreciated by all.







Typical MULTIPLE DISC BRAKE applications


